In <u>Theme</u> this term, the children in Year 4 will be taken on a journey across the oceans lead by famous explorers, raiders and traders from history. We will be learning about the Viking voyages from Scandinavia and their settlement in 9th Century England. We will also be diving into the Pacific Ocean to understand the strength and determination of Captain Cook on his voyage to Antarctica. Lastly, we shall be examining the ambitions and subsequent impacts form Christopher Columbus's voyages to the Americas.

In <u>Maths</u>, we will continue to further enhance our understanding and application of decimals. We will then progress on to money and learning how to tell the time. We will then concentrate on statistics, properties of shape and end finally on learning how to use coordinates in position and directions.

This term in <u>P.E</u>, the children will be taking part in athletic events in preparation for our school Sports Day. They will also be navigating the local area with the use of digital mapping techniques.



In <u>RE</u>, we will be building upon understanding and appreciating the natural world which focusses on the uniqueness of the Earth as our world that everyone has a duty to respect and conserve. We will explore how various faiths have explained some of life's big and difficult to answer questions.
