It only seems like yesterday that he was a baby requiring my help for everything and already he is so determined to be independent. As parents, having children is such a constant worry isn't it? Over the past few weeks in our assemblies, we have been discussing tolerance, which is a key driver within our curriculum. 

Percentage of pupils reaching the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths




#### Reading KS2 2019:



### Teacher contact

### Term Time Absence

Children are not entitled to holidays during term time. Therefore, any planned absence will usually not be authorised. If you wish to take your child out of school during term time, a request must be put in writing to the Head of School well in advance. This must state the reasons why your child has to be absent from school. Term time absence can only be approved if there are exceptional circumstances. The school will act upon its power to ask the local authority to fine parents who take unauthorised holidays in time term and also when attendance is a concern. Unauthorised absence may result in prosecuation or a Fixed Penalty Notice.

### School Money

School dinners can now be paid through the website www.schoolmoney.co.uk. Individual login details have been sent to each parent/carer through the school texting service. If you have not received any login details please check with the school office. This payment service can also be used for Breakfast and After-School Clubs.

### Safeguarding and Well Being
