Now we are going to learn about some of the symbols different religions use.

- The khanda is a symbol to Sikhs of God and truthfulness. The circle in the centre represents God being eternal it has no beginning and no end.

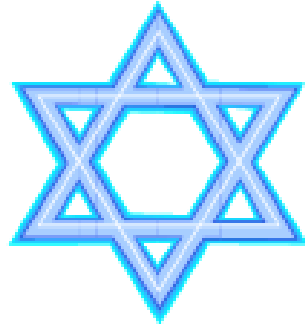
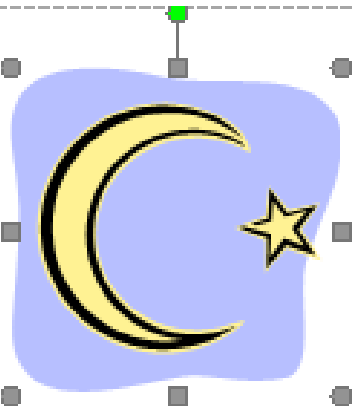


- The wheel is the Buddhist symbol of life, an endless cycle of birth and rebirth.
