The theme for this year's

Anti-Bullying week was 'Make a noise about bullying'. Across the school, children took part in activities to make a noise about bullying.

EYFS - Discussed what they can do to help if they see someone being unkind Year I – Talked about what bullying is and how it feels to be bullied. Then they thought about the different ways they can help each other and how important being able to help is.

Year 2 – Did some role-play and acted out some scenes where friends stand up to bullies and make a noise about bullying.

Year 3 - Made a poster to make a noise about bullying.

Year 4 – Watched the anti-bullying website videos and shared their thoughts as a class.

Y5 — Thought really carefully about what bullying is and what banter is. They then thought about when banter can turn into bullying and made a poster to show their learning.

Y6 – Took the learning in Year 5 a step further and created a Bantometer to show examples of scenarios or actions and where they fell on the Bantometer; banter or bullying.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed their discos, games and Christmas activities!




