## Hello!

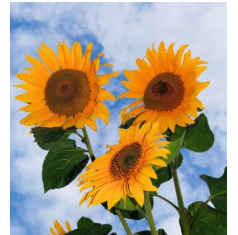

This term, the children will be learning all about Growing! We will be talking about how we have grown and changed over time as well as learning about how plants grow and survive.

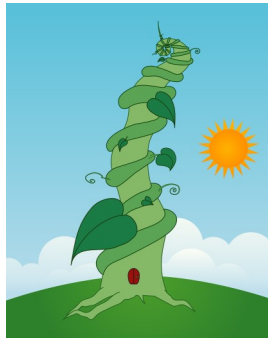
## Beanstalks
